ANZAC ACTIVITIES 2017

WREATH LAYING SERVICE

Monday, 24th April at 3.45pm

All members and their families are invited to the Wreath Laying Service at the Cenotaph on Monday, 24th April at 3.45pm. Last year we had a very good rollup and we hope to achieve the same this year.

Members and relatives are to assemble on the G.P.O. side near the corner of Pitt Street and Martin Place at around 3.15pm, ready to form up at 3.40pm for the short walk across to the Cenotaph. Medals to be worn by veterans and can be worn by descendants on the right breast.

The Marshal will be John Hayden, son of the late Captain John Hayden 2/1st, and the bugler will be Darcy Henderson, Kay Burton's grandson, daughter of the late 2/1st member Bert Rayner.

Personal family wreaths may be laid following the official ceremony.

ANZAC DAY MARCH

Tuesday, 25th April

The route of the March and assembly will be as last year. Note: There will be no Land Rover transportation for veterans. Maxi Taxi will be provided but will probably be at the front of WWII Army and will be occupied by 8.30am.

Veterans' seating is indicated near St James Station on the Eastern side of Elizabeth Street. War Widows' seating will probably be somewhere opposite the Veterans' seating. The dispersal area is left into Liverpool Street towards OXFORD Street, access to MUSEUM Station will be back along the footpath for approximately 100 metres. However this may alter at the Marshall's discretion and some may be sent further down Elizabeth Street towards the South, the access to Museum Station will be the entrance in Castlereagh Street, north corner of Liverpool Street (under the old Mark Foys building).

The Occidental Hotel is once again the venue for the ANZAC Day reunion, which is situated on the corner of York and Erskine Sts, Sydney, opposite Wynyard Park.


The foyer will again be manned by Geoff Finlay, Ray Law and David Herron who will collect the lunch fee for men and women and issue name tags.

site of what was one of the largest military




