ANZAC ACTIVITIES 2018

WREATH LAYING SERVICE

Tuesday, 24th April at 3.45pm

All members, descendants and families are invited to the Wreath Laying Service at the Cenotaph on Tuesday, 24th April at 3.45pm. Last year we had a record attendance and it would be wonderful to have similar numbers again.

All veterans and relatives to assemble on the G.P.O. side of Martin Place near the corner of Pitt Street at about 3.15pm ready to form up at 3.40pm for the short walk across to the Cenotaph. Medals to be worn by veterans and can be worn by descendants on the right hand side.

The Marshal will be John Hayden, son of the late Captain John Hayden 2/1, and the bugler will be Darcy Henderson, Kay Burton's grandson, daughter of the late Bert Rayner 2/1 Both John and Darcy have provided this service for some years and should be commended.

Unit wreaths to be laid by Don Crawford, veteran 2/2nd and personal wreaths may be laid after the unit wreath is presented.

ANZAC DAY MARCH

Wednesday, 25th April

The route of the March is as per the attached map. There will be no Land Rovers for veterans. However, golf buggies are being provided and will be located at the corner of Hunter and Phillip Sts. These do not need to be booked.

As per the March Map the Pioneers are in group 13 WWII Australian Army Sixth Division, forming up in Phillip St (south) facing north towards Hunter Street. There should be marshalls displaying the Sixth Division signs and the Unit banners will be displayed. Expected start time is approx 9.30am, so we should be formed up by 8.45am approx.

The best entry points will be from Hunter St East or West or down from Macquarie St. Elizabeth St will be barricaded off on both sides from Martin Place to Hunter St as this is the start zone. There will be no passing the Cenotaph, so the eyes left will be held at the ANZAC Memorial in Hyde Park. A marshall will be positioned at roadside edge to indicate the eyes left command, hats to be removed and right hands left over the heart until the unit is clear of the Memorial, heads to be turned towards the Memorial when passing it. Banners and flags to be lowered during this period.

Veteran's seating is indicated on the map near St James Station on the eastern side of Elizabeth Street. The dispersal area is left into Liverpool Street towards Oxford Street or right or straight ahead at the discretion of the marshalls. Museum Station will be the exit point to progress to the reunion at Wynyard Station.

ANZAC DAY REUNION

Wednesday, 25th April

The Occidental Hotel is once again the venue for the ANZAC Day reunion lunch, which is situated on the corner of York and Erskine Sts, Sydney, opposite Wynyard Park.

The lunch will have a cost of \$35 per head, for all attending, which includes main and dessert. The cost of beer jugs for this year is set at \$18 per jug.

The foyer will again be manned by Geoff Finlay, Ray Law and David Herron who will collect the lunch cost and issue name tags.

Members should be seated by approx 12.00 noon depending on the march start time being achieved. Exit from Wynyard Station via Exit 3 will bring those attending out the new escalators into York St and across Erskine St to the hotel.








ANZAC DAY BAND AT NATIONAL & STATE EVENTS


